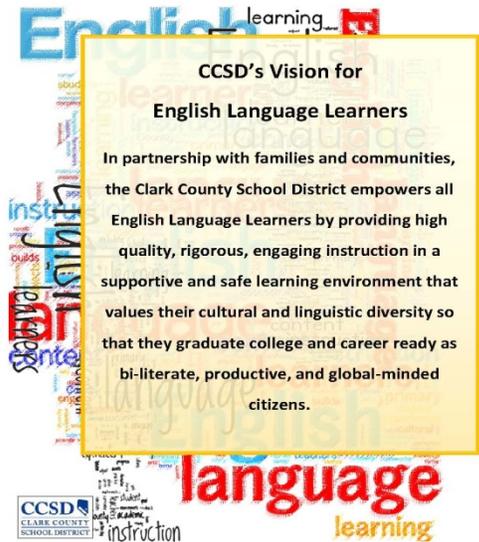


Reading Horizons is a web-based and direct instruction program that promotes gains in reading achievement and assists English Language Learners (ELLs) in reaching English language and literacy proficiency. Research has found that ELLs have the most success learning to read when taught with instruction that is explicit, systematic, and multi-sensory in nature. The Reading Horizons method leverages the power of this research-based approach in a way that is practical for teachers to teach and simple for students to learn. With just 40-60 hours of web-based instruction, coupled with face-to-face instruction, Newcomers, students who have received less than two years of instruction in U.S. schools, can develop strong foundational reading and literacy skills in English. The Reading Horizons Elevate program assesses each ELL's Phonemic Awareness and Lexile® level, then provides a Diagnostic Assessment to create individualized learning plans to increase proficiency in decoding, vocabulary, fluency, and reading comprehension. As growth occurs, the computer adaptive software increases text complexity to adapt to students' needs and abilities and unlocks additional informational texts in the online RH Elevate Library. CCSD ELLs' reading growth is measured by Lexile gains from Reading Assessments automatically administered biannually.

Reading Horizons supports the ELL Master Plan by providing Newcomers a supplemental resource that teachers can offer to diversify instructional models as needed.

Who is Eligible?

During 2016-17, this Title III supplemental program will be offered to all secondary CCSD ELL Newcomers, students who have received less than two years of instruction in U.S. schools. Eligibility is determined by each student's 2016 annual English Language Proficiency Assessment WIDA ACCESS Composite or Reading scores of 1.0-2.9. Students new to the country or new to CCSD who have taken the WIDA placement assessment (W-APT) will also be eligible for Reading Horizons if they have earned a score of 1.0-2.9.

Instructional Recommendations

Usage recommendations for optimal achievement:

- Use 20 minutes daily for 30 weeks to reach 40 hours minimally
- Use the blended learning approach with software and direct instruction from teachers' kit lessons
- Promote students' acquisition of the English language by planning for student interaction with games and responding to text through discourse and in writing
- Promote independent practice in students' workbooks
- Utilize data to build differentiated, flexible, small groups

Implementation Options

Implementation options include:

- Elective or Block Class
 - Before or After School Tutoring Program
 - Access from home on iPad or home computer
- Recommendations for teachers:
- Create rotation schedule
 - Provide data based instruction to small groups while other students independently work through software activities or in-group.

ELL Newcomers need to learn foundational literacy skills to access and begin to master content and language standards in English. This bottom-up approach for teaching reading must be coupled with a top-down approach. Since research supports the development of a second language through the integration of listening, speaking, reading, and writing, extending the provided comprehension questions to include rich, grade-level, rigorous learning opportunities through the implementation of NVACS English Language Arts Standards, is a must.
